Program to provide free studio space to Idaho artists

A program called Artists in Residence will grant up to three artists at a time free studio space in the 8th Street Marketplace @ BoDo for three months. AiR represents a partnership among the ownership of the **newly remodeled** marketplace, *Boise Weekly* and Boise City's Department of Arts & History.

"This is a wonderful opportunity for local artists, both emerging artists with great promise and established artists with proven track records," Boise Department of Arts & History Public Art Manager Karen Bubb said in a release. "These are the types of public-private partnerships that we embrace and encourage; investment in the talent of home-grown artists for the benefit of the community at large."

The public will be able to interact with the artists in their studios on First Thursdays, and artists will be asked to leave one work of art behind for a gallery. Artists can apply for AiR by sending a letter of interest, resume, work sample and letter of recommendation to Bubb at the **Department of Arts & History** by Jan. 20. The residencies will run Feb. 1 to April 24 and May 1 to July 24.
